
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
What do reviewers assess in health promotion projects?

What do reviewers look for in *Impact*?





Implementation Plan

Is the study design appropriate?

Are the target numbers justified or realistic?

 Recruit n patients for a rare disease in a short period of time Is the study period too short to achieve the objectives?
 Is there any potential problems that could be anticipated and how to handle?

How to assess implementation fidelity and how to ensure the project is run according to what we plan?

Who are the collaborators and how do they help?



Evaluation Plan

Is that what we're doing working?



Why or why not?



How do we show the value of the work we do?

Construct	Definition
Reach	The number, proportion, and representativeness of individuals who are willing to participate in an intervention
Effectiveness	The impact of an intervention on important outcomes, including potential negative effects, quality of life, and economic outcomes
Adoption	The absolute number, proportion, and representation of settings and intervention agents who are willing to initiate an intervention
Implementation	The intervention agents' fidelity to the various components of an intervention's protocol (e.g., delivery as intended)
Maintenance	The extent to which an intervention or policy becomes institutionalized or part of routine practice and policy

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Evaluation Plan

Reach: do you have good representatives in the population?

Effectiveness: are the outcome indicators appropriate and specific? Any negative effects? Economic effects?

Adoption: which setting and by who? By observation?

Implementation: delivered as planned? Self-report?

By observation?

Maintenance: for how long? By who? Any audits?



More tips...

Use the correct template:

- Applications which do not use the standard proposal template for Research and Health Promotion Project respectively (Section 10 of e-Form) will be treated as incomplete.
- The proposal templates can be downloaded from the Secretariat's website.

Pay attention to the guidance notes:

- pre-set criteria for process and outcome evaluation based on the <u>RE-AIM</u>
 framework

Tell the science in a good story!!!

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
